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This is an excellent paper. It would be useful if in their discussion the authors could review the evidence in the recent Huldtgren et al. paper in Science (v. 234, p. 1696-1699) which concludes that the common Doushantuo microfossils are not animal embryos. Huldtgren et al. show preservation of envelopes for the the specimens which they studied. This study shows the lack of preservation of an animal embryo envelope. What are the implications of this study for the interpretations made by Huldtgren et al., if any?
