However, I remain concerned about the excessive number of figures, which could obscure the storyline. Also, I did not observe any highlighted new findings. Furthermore, the new title does not seem appropriate as the focus extends beyond microbial carbon dynamics alone. I believe the manuscript could be suitable for publication with revisions to the title, a reduction in the number of figures (especially the ones that they didn't even discuss in the manuscript), and a clearer highlighting of their new findings.
